

Policy: Graduation Requirements

The goal of the program is to graduate professionals who are able to function as competent, entry-level radiation therapists. In support of this goal, the NM School of Radiation Therapy awards a certificate of completion for students who have:

- Completed all didactic courses with final course grades of C (77%) or better
- Completed all clinical practicum courses with final course grades of C (80%) or better
- Completed all ARRT mandated competencies
 - Students who have not completed the required competencies at the time of graduation may receive an extension in order to complete competencies. Clinical assignments post-graduation will be scheduled by the program director and may be limited to ensure adequate student supervision. In addition, program extension may not interfere with the clinical experience of enrolled radiation therapy students. Under no circumstances can the program be extended more than 20 days beyond the last day of the final semester to accommodate a student's completion of clinical competencies.
- Completed clinical make-up time (in excess of allotted PTO)
- Paid tuition in full
